

In 1517, Martin Luther, the namesake of the Lutheran tradition, posted his 95 theses on the door of the local church in Wittenburg, Germany. (A copy of the 95 theses hang in the Narthex of Calvary Lutheran as well.) Always celebrated on the last Sunday in October, Reformation Sunday honors the work of Martin Luther. As the season changes and we approach this day, I find myself reflecting on how the spirit of the Reformation still informs the liturgy and the way we worship today.

Martin Luther, along with other reformers, was committed to making faith accessible to all people. He believed that the Word of God, the sacraments, and the music of the church should be available to everyone—not just reserved for bishops, priests, or scholars. Luther recognized that Jesus wanted all His people to receive the bread and wine and to hear the Word clearly.

One of Luther's most notable and impactful works was his translation of the Bible. Originally written in the ancient languages of Hebrew, Aramaic and Greek, Luther first translated the New Testament into German which was published in 1522. His translation of the Old Testamentwas published in 1534. Luther shaped his translation so the Word of God could be understood and felt in the hearts of the people, and not just studied by the scholars. In doing so, he made the gospel truly accessible to all.

Luther also believed and taught that baptism is central to Christian life. He viewed baptism as a daily renewal of God's promises. Though a single event, our baptism is in action each day providing freedom from sin and death, and serves as a reminder of God's continuous grace. Luther also brought attention to the power of song in worship and wrote hymns to give voice to the praises of the people. He was adamant that worship be a place of accessibility, hospitality, and joy.

For Luther, the church was never to be an exclusive "members-only" club. The church, both the local congregation and the global body of Christ, is open to all, where everyone should feel welcome, comfortable, and inspired to grow in faith. As we worship during this month of October, let us look towards Reformation Sunday and say a prayer of thanks for Luther and his incredible work!
