The Face of Jesus

What if, in every interaction we have, we imagined we were looking into the face of Jesus? Not as a metaphor, but quite literally, pausing long enough to picture Christ looking back at us through the eyes of the person in front of us.

At the grocery store. In traffic. At school. On social media. On the television. Across the table from someone who disagrees with us. In conversations that feel tense, rushed, or misunderstood.

Would we say the things we say? Would we do the things we do? Would we think the thoughts we think?


Jesus himself invites us into this way of seeing. In Matthew's Gospel, he tells us, "Just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me" (Matthew 25:40, NRSV). Jesus locates himself not in abstraction, but in people...in real, imperfect, complicated people.

We live in a tumultuous world, one that constantly urges us to take sides, draw lines, and reduce one another to labels. It is easy to forget that Jesus never looks at us that way. While we often see only actions or opinions, Jesus sees hearts. As Scripture reminds us, "The Lord does not see as mortals see; they look at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart" (1 Samuel 16:7).

Jesus sees the choices we make, and it is safe to say he is not pleased with all of them, but he does not hold them against us. Instead, his heart breaks for us. He understands the pain, fear, and heartbreak that sometimes lead to the choices we wish we had not made. As Paul writes, "While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). Grace comes first. Always.

When we begin to see others the way Jesus sees us, with honesty, compassion, and mercy, we are freed from the burden of judgment and invited into empathy. Jesus tells us, "Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful" (Luke 6:36).

So let us look at one another differently. Let us intentionally see the face of Jesus in each person we encounter...pausing, imagining, and allowing that vision to shape how we speak, how we act, and how we love.

With all the misinformation and stories floating through society, I came across 3 questions to ask before sharing something online or in person.

1. Is it true? Verify the source and gather more information before sharing it with others.

Calvary Memories...

... of Friday Morning Men's Fellowship

I asked my brothers and sister what they remembered about the beginning of Calvary's Men's Fellowship. Our dad, John Haugland, made coffee for the group. Pastor Roger Olson came to Calvary Lutheran in 1963. Roger believed they began meeting in 1963 or 1964. John was dedicated, setting up Thursday afternoons, so he just had to plug the coffee in Friday mornings. He obtained day old doughnuts from Myer's Bakery for snacks. The men's coffee and doughnuts (if the designated volunteer remembers) is continuing today with 25 to 20 men meeting each Friday at 7 am.

The men's group started meeting in the pastor's office off the west door of the original church and later, meeting in the original Fellowship Hall when the office was out-grown.

Roger began the weekly meeting asking the group broad topics such as "What makes you happy?" to get the conversation going. Outside speakers from the community came to inform the group of matters of interest. The weekly lessons of the church were also shared. In the 1960's Roger led weekly Bethel Bible Study classes, and it was often reviewed at Men's Fellowship.

The men with the help of the Luther League Youth Group held an annual deer/turkey season barbecue. In the 1960's, the deer season-opener was a much bigger event than it is today. Three cinder block spits the length of the parking lot were set up for barbequing the turkey for a popular dinner and to take home.

The Luther Leaguer's responsibility was embalming what seemed like thousands of turkey carcasses in preparation for the spit according to my brother Mark. The process involved an apparatus consisting of a rubber tube, the end was as placed in a gallon jug of pale-yellow liquid (as I recall some concoction of lemon juice, salt, garlic and who knows what else). The other end of the tube was attached by a one-way valve to a syringe with a barrel the size of a toilet paper roll. The Luther Leaguer would pull back on the piston, aspirating the yellow stuff into the barrel, insert the hollow needle into the turkey flesh, and then pumping it full of deliciousness-to-be. Each breast and thigh got many stabs and doses. Each drumstick and proximal wing got fewer. After this grisly operation, the countertops and floor of the church kitchen were wet and slimy with blood-tinged leakage. Valiant Luther Leaguers cleaned up the mess.

Early members of the Men's Fellowship included Russ Skoe, Dr. Paul Grimes, John Haugland, brothers Erling & Jake Jacobson, Ozzie Anderson, and Mark Sherman, a member of St. Peter's Catholic Church.

Roger left Calvary Lutheran for Christ the King Lutheran in Moorhead in 1970. Men's Fellowship continued after he left and his return after retiring.



Reports:

Secretary's Report: Motion by Sara Forsberg, 2nd Stuart Larson to approve September 9th, 2025 minutes, carried.
